- e. Comment critically on the condition of the inner rooms of the aristocratic family of Mrinal's in-laws.
- f. Discuss two major symbols used in Vijay Tendulkar's play *Silence! The Court is in Session.*
- g. Show how Benare's education and employment are accused of spreading promiscuity in the society in *Silence! The Court is in Session*.
- h. Compare and contrast the two female characters of Benare and Mrs. Kashikar.
